Abbey was another very important collector of Bookbindings-- they were sold in 2 sales by Sotheby's along with many other book treasures including illuminated medieval manuscripts in a number of sales. If you are interested in bookbindings then the Abbey Bookbinding sales catalogues are important to own but they are often expensive I worked in greater London for several years and frequently visited the British Museum where the British Library was housed prior to it moving into a new building of its own. I was able to look at a number of display cases of Books, Illuminated Manuscripts and Bookbinding among other things. I developed major interests in many areas I saw including bookbinding This book will make a lot more sense to you if you have seen some bookbindings As bindings are fragile often only a small display is on show, with large shows on various occasions The sections are British Bindings. Numbers 1--250 Irish Bindings Numbers 251--270 Scottish Bindings. Numbers. 271--285 Netherlandish Binding. Numbers. 286--320 German and Austrian Bindings. Numbers 321--367 Danish Bindings. Numbers. 368 Index of binders Index of owners Marijam Foot is a world authority on bookbinding and an ideal person to catalogue the Henry Davis Gift She wrote all three catalogues. She has also been doing extensive research on bookbinding in tandem with writing these volumes. Check her page The Henry Davis Gift are examples of first class bookbinding catalogues. They are well worth getting if you can afford them Be warned, books on important bookbinding collections are often expensive, so think carefully if you want to enter this field. I saw some of the Henry Davis Gift among other bookbindings when I worked in London and that sparked my interest. You may have seen some of the Pierpont Morgan. Bindings or other bookbindings in various American Museums. If you really like them then think about putting a small collection together These bookbindings are very much at the upper end of the market. If you are a craft binder you may want to get one or two books like these, but they don't teach you much on how to practice craft bookbinding Henry Davis Gift: v. 3: A Collection of Bookbindings (Catalogue of South European Bindings) This is another volume on the Henry Davis Gift See my review The Henry Davis Gift As you can see be looking at the contents of volume two and three there are a number of strengths in The Henry Davis Collection It has some 250 British bindings and some 200 French Bindings and nearly 200 Italian Bindings in a collection of some 800 bindings There are small collections of bindings from a number of other countries Henry Davis tended to collect important bindings that were bound by major binders for important owners ( see list of binders and list of provenance) These bindings are well worth getting to know. Much of the important bookbinding literature has black and white pictures so you need to get a feel for these. Bindings in Colour If you can see some bookbindings in colour you often see a number of new points of interest One of my favourite books of bindings in colour is Art Nouveau and Art Deco Bookbinding: French Masterpieces 1880-1940 See the reviews with photos You may or may not like the bindings but I suspect a number will catch your eye Beautifully illustrated in colour--some 200 colour illustrations I think this book is well worth buying. I think its issue price was \$75 USD but I may be wrong. If you are unsure about it see if you can interloan a copy Beautiful Bookbindings This is a brief introduction to bookbinding over the last 1,000 years with a selection of some 100 bindings from around the world The illustrations are in colour See the reviewers comments Other helps ABC of Bookbinding: An Illustrated Glossary of Terms for Collectors and Conservators This is an excellent tool full of helpful information. It is modelled on the famous ABC for Book Collectors -- multiple editions I live in New Zealand so I might have the information wrong The University of Virginia runs a Rare Book School each year for the lucky few who get in See their website It has a very useful reading guide -- it will be of aid in helping find good books and it may mention some as expensive and best consulted in libraries. Eg E P Goldschmidt's " Gothic and Renaissance Bookbindings " 1928 ( a major work of research in 2 large volumes from memory
