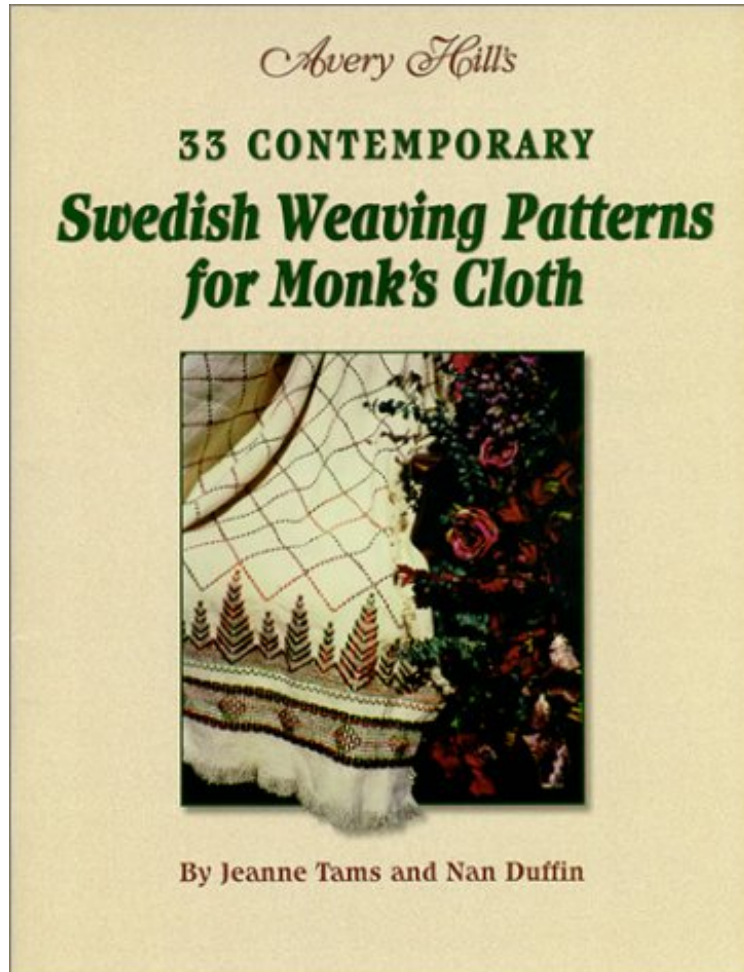

Not The Best Book For Beginners!By WDAs other reviewers have stated, the patterns in this book are fairly easy to follow - particularly for those having counted cross-stitch experience. Unfortunately, the person providing the product picture chose to show only the cover pattern, rather than including those pictured on the back cover.My complaint about this book - and the reason for the 3-star rating - has to do with the fact that the majority of the patterns do NOT show a starting point - a MAJOR issue for someone who is 1) a beginner, and 2) not familiar with counted cross-stitch. In spite of the beautiful patterns, I will probably lean toward other weaving books for the simple fact that I don't want to spend unnecessary time figuring out the starting point -

something I feel the authors should have provided. Of note is the fact that another Avery Hill book ("The How to Book of Swedish Weaving and Huck Embroidery"), authored by Jeanne Tams, DOES provide the starting point. Quite honestly, I would recommend "The How to Book....." over the one being reviewed. It has a wider variety of patterns - ALL with the starting point clearly marked. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
