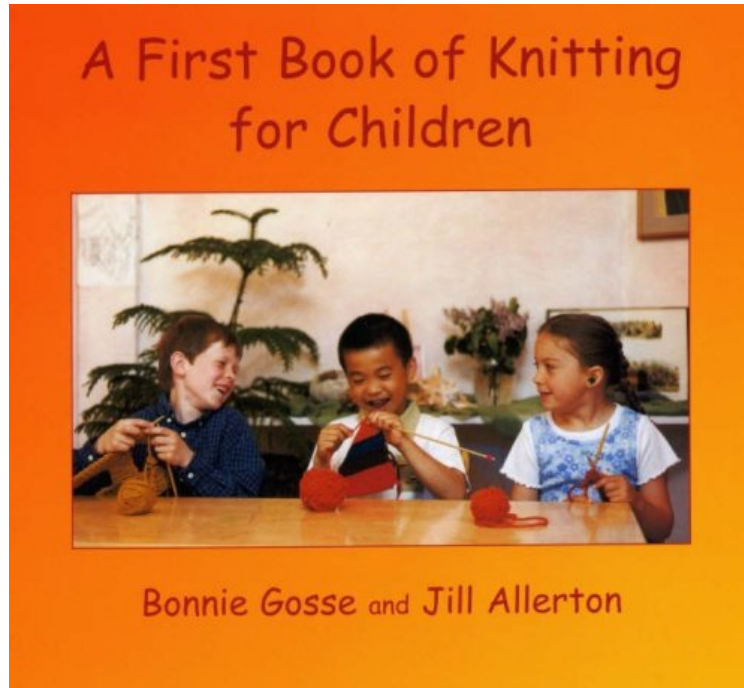

Handwork teachers, parents, and other adults who want to learn how to knit will find that the simple instructions, the interesting patterns, and the artistic photographs make this book a must-have for their collection of handbooks and references.
