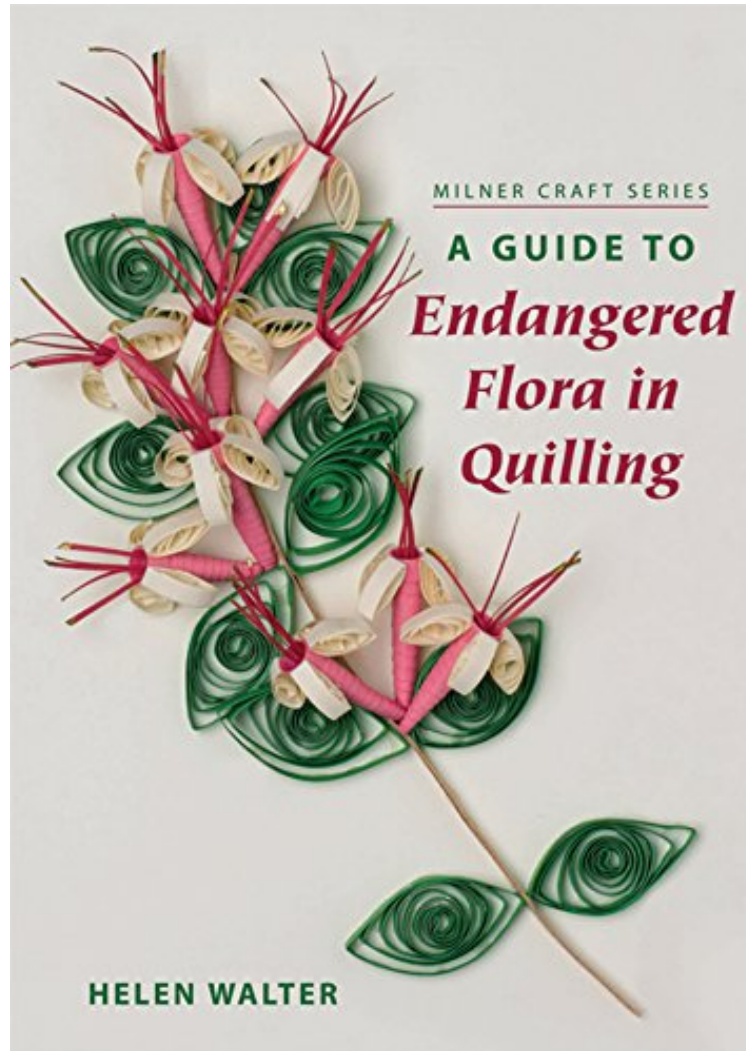

Yes it has basic instructions for creating the shapes and it lists sizes and quantities of the pieces needed for each flower, but every flower in this book is less than impressive and lacks any amount of difficulty. If you're a beginner it might be ok, but you'll tire of it quickly if you're anything like me. I learned more from you tube videos as a raw beginner than I did from looking through this book. I would return it, but

since I bought it used I'd only be recouping a couple bucks. The only reason it got 2 stars is for the list of suppliers by country in the back of the book. This is definitely not a book for anyone even remotely beyond the beginner's stage and I still wouldn't recommend it to beginners due to its lack of comprehensive instruction on creating shapes and because the pieces in the pics don't have a professional, crisp look to them. It offers many challenges. It helps to identify the many flowers that are seen, but of course, don't have labels on them in the wild!
