Super cute but some mistakes in the patterns By joy I've made the cubcake, the baby bunny, the puppy, the panda, and now working on the tiger and chick. They are super adorable and are just the right size. They are easy to make, but there are some mistakes in the patterns. For example, this is for part of the chick: Round 1: Dc around. 10 sts Round 2: (2dc into each st. 20 sts) Rounds 3 - 6: Dc around. 10 sts For part of the baby bunny, from 24 sts, it says to 2dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc = 32 sts. My math says that's 30 sts, not 32 sts. I can usually catch it and either unravel the stitches or make adjustments, but it's definitely disappointing that they didn't take the time to proofread the patterns. Still, the photos are cute and the patterns seem to be arranged from easy to difficult. The book also uses UK crochet terms (double crochet = single crochet). I would still recommend it but would just warn others to watch out for mistakes in the patterns. 7 of 7 people found the following review helpful. Great

One thing to be aware of is that this is written in UK terms so US crocheters will need to make the changes. The one issue with the patterns is that every one I have made has had at least one math error in the pattern and some have multiple errors so it took some time to sort through and make corrections. Overall, I'm happy with the book and will make more projects from it.

Children of all ages will love these wonderful Amigurumi characters. Amigurumi is the popular Japanese art of making stuffed crocheted toys, which is easy to learn and fast to do. The yarn is worked with a smaller size of hook than is usual for the weight of yarn, which produces a closely woven fabric without any gaps through which stuffing might escape. The cute figures are bound to become much-loved favourites in the toy box. The 11 toys featured are fun to make, and every project is accompanied by clear instructions describing how to achieve perfect results. You can follow them to the letter or use them as a basis for your own creations. In addition, a techniques section explains all the basic skills needed, making them suitable for experienced crocheters and novices alike. Quick to make, these designs are an ideal way of using up oddments of yarn and make perfect portable projects for crocheters on the go.
