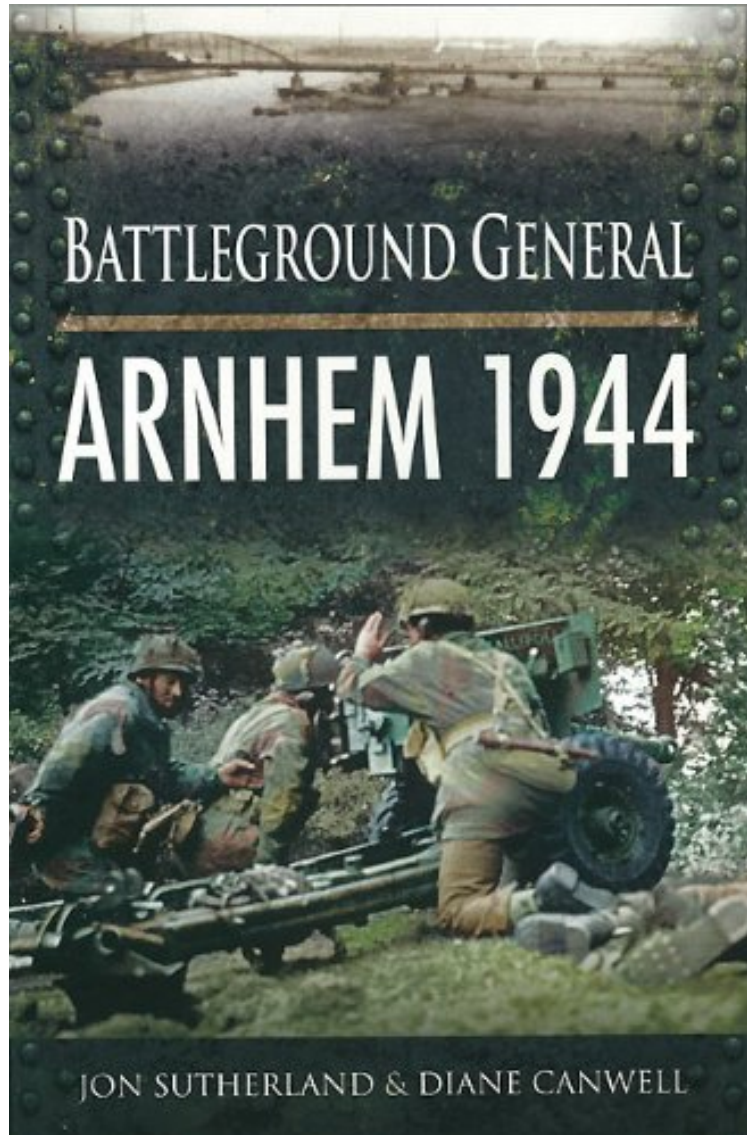

After a brief intro to the 1944 Battle of Arnhem Bridge (the northern portion of the Market-Garden campaign), YOU assume the role of either the British or German general on the battlefield, making decisions. You go through about 20 decision rounds to get to your final result. For example, after

visiting a subordinate's outpost and getting a briefing, you might have to decide whether to order him to attack or hold back. You will then go to the next decision round. The book does a lot of things right: it conveys the fog of war and the great difficulty of making combat decisions based on incomplete and changing information. However, and this is key, the book does not really teach you what you are doing right or wrong. Compare with John Antal's fun books like "Armor Attacks" or "Infantry Combat" which not only put you in the "choose-your-own-adventure" realm but use the exercises to teach you about tactics and good decision-making. In comparison, this book unfortunately gives very little feedback. At the end of the decision tree, you might be forced back across the river, win a clear victory, etc., but there's no after-action analysis to show you how your decisions affected the outcome. The writing and battle descriptions are great, but the writing team needs to focus on 1) better maps and TOE; 2) more feedback on what your decisions are doing to help you or the enemy. If successful it might have shortened the war by months. Will the brave British paratroopers be able to seize the vital bridge at Arnhem and hold it until reinforcements fight their way through? Or will the Germans be able to recover the initiative and crush them in a skillful counterattack? The book presents you with a series of command decisions, aided by situation maps; directing you to the next relevant briefing depending on the option you choose. No dice are necessary to play, just this book and your tactical skill. When you buy this book, the fate of nations is in your hands.
