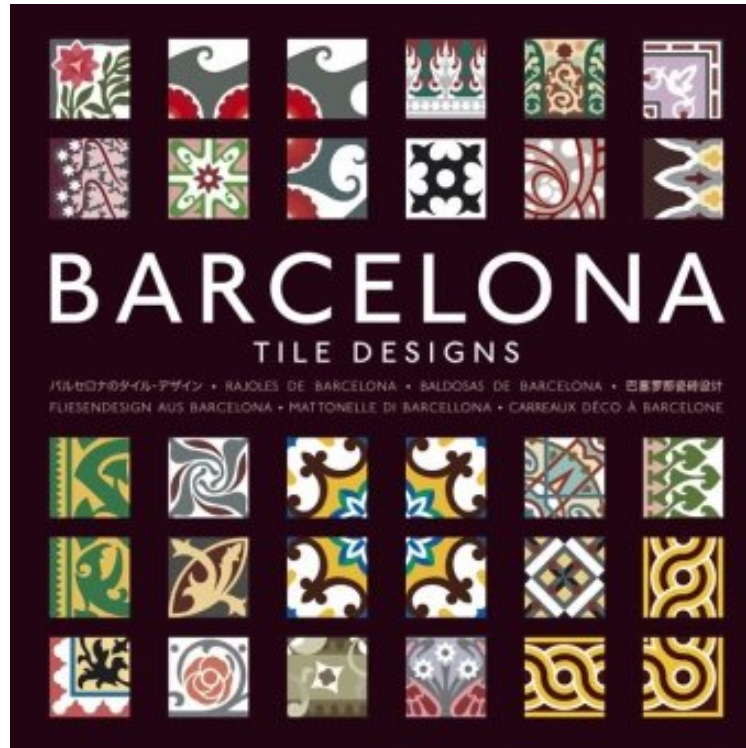

In Barcelona, the design of such tiles reached its peak in the age of 'Modernismo', the Spanish variety of Art Nouveau, in the early 20th century. Both single tiles and whole patterns and borders are shown, and the files on the CO make it possible to create designs in any shape and size.
