The clamor of the 16th century drove this famous engraver onBy Jane in MilwaukeeMany museum pieces of needlework made before the 19th century were inspired or directly copied from books of engraving designs specifically for textiles. The year after Queen Elizabeth I of England died, 1604, Johan Seibmacher was allowed to publish his book of engravings in Nuremburg. He needed the permission of the Holy Roman Emperor. This 1975 Dover edition copies the 1880 republication of the original work. You can see how ornate the engravings were because the title page and another pictorial are shown here. The pictorial is interesting. It is an elaborate drawing of 3 ladies who represent Wisdom, Diligence and Idleness and the poem caption has been translated:Let her who cares for needlework,And wishes to perform the same,Learn thoroughly and never shirk,And she'll obtain both praise and fame.Yeah, right. Anyway, what follows is page after page of great graphs!! Honestly, these are sublime folk designs, many in elegant repeat patterns but also some separate motifs and pictorials

like a lady and gentleman from the 1600's, generally called the Baroque era. These designs are directly in line with these lovely books: *Charted Folk Designs for Cross-Stitch Embroidery: 278 Charts of Ancient Folk Embroideries from the Countries Along the Danube* (Dover Needlework) *101 Folk Designs for Counted Cross-Stitch and Other Needlecrafts* (Dover Needlework) *Charted Peasant Designs from Saxon Transylvania* (Dover Embroidery, Needlepoint) This is a nice book to have around, especially for these prices.

Originally published in 1604, with the printing privilege of the Holy Roman Emperor, this pattern book contains 99 charted designs that modern needleworkers will find intricate and challenging. Richly detailed, with the look of medieval tapestries, these baroque designs will appeal to all people experienced in needlepoint, cross-stitch embroidery or other needle crafts.
