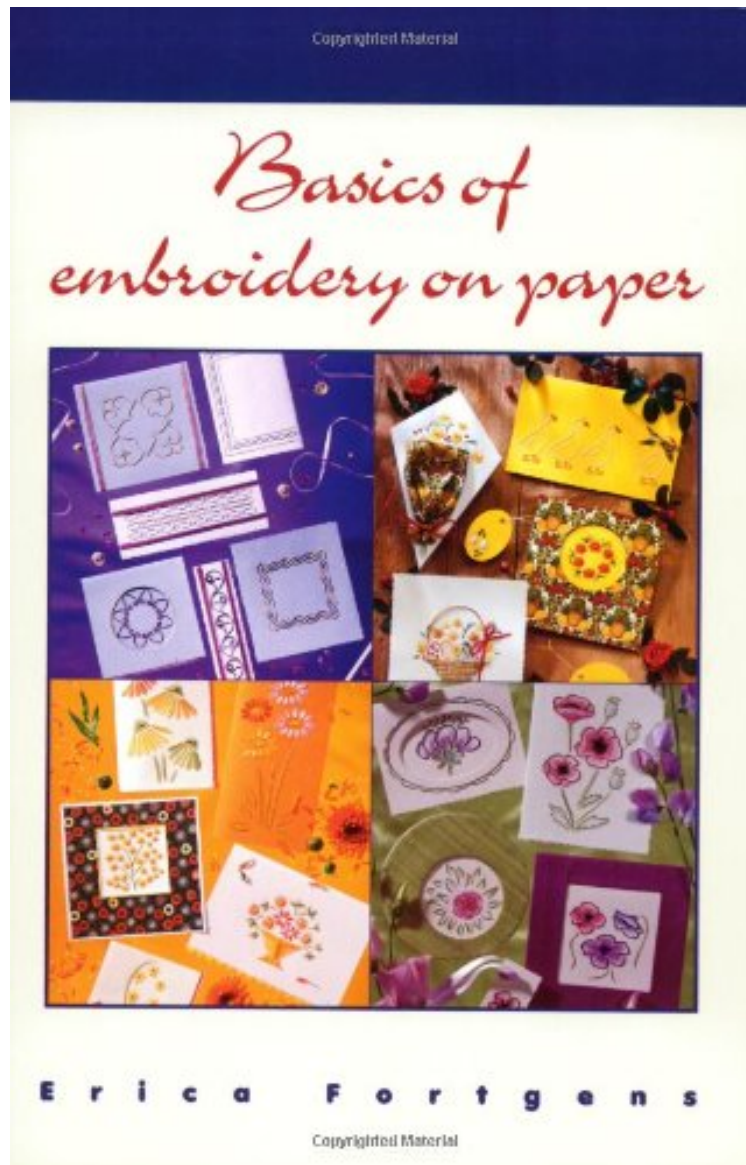

title "Basics of Embroidery on Paper" by Erica Fortunes is a bit of a misnomer. While I gave this 4 stars for the excellent diagrams and good color photos in the bulk of the book (the part entitled "Enjoy Embroidery on Paper"), the beginning consists of only three brief and inadequate pages. The "Materials" section is a short page consisting mostly of "Erica" tools - no pictures, no information on where to find them. There is no information on what types of paper can be used and how to treat them. The next two pages "Techniques" contain one small illustration and hardly qualifies to get someone started. If you buy this book, buy it for the designs; don't expect it to teach you anything. 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Disappointed in quality of patterns By J. Cooper There are a lot of good designs in this book -- all stunning. However, please proceed with caution! I've found at least 3 patterns that have errors in them! Some of the errors are easy to fix -- those that have missing dots. Unfortunately, other errors are too many dots -- and these are not caught until the pattern's been punched, and stitching has started. These errors are frustrating and costly -- both in wasted time and wasted materials. (Case in point is page 150 -- for the circle, there should only be 7 dots between each spoke, not 8.) 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. I was hoping for simple instructions starting off and building from there but instead I feel that it starts off with more advanced projects. It might be better later on but not for beginners.
