The principle is basically the same as amigurumi, but the toys are jointed and much larger than your tiny yarn animals. If you have never crocheted toys, I recommend that you first get the hang of it with some of the "easy amigurumi" books out there, otherwise you might get lost in the instructions. Not that they are difficult, but my eyes would start to water if I had to stick to every word. As for the toys themselves, they are cute, better than many I've seen in other books, which is why I rate this 5 stars.
