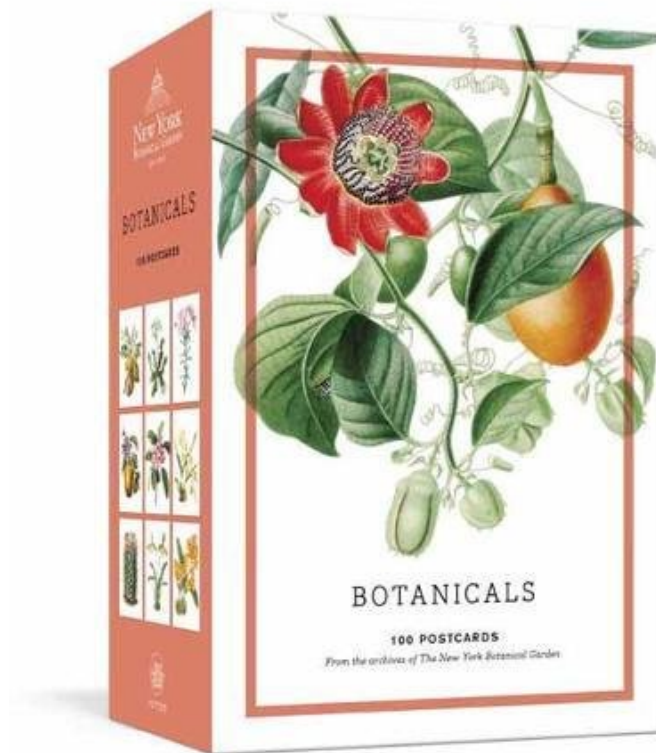

However, if you regularly send cards to one person, there isn't much variation. Each illustration is unique and attractive. But all appear to be by the same (uncredited) illustrator, so they look quite similar. The card design is also similar: matte finish, somewhat muted colors on white background, English-language identification text box in the same spot. Most images are roughly the same size as well. So these cards look surprisingly alike despite the good mix of plants. (Plant lovers might also wish there were more information about the plant on the reverse.) If it comes back into print, 100 Fruit Vegetables from the RHS: 100 Postcards in a Box is a far more exciting postcard set.

The beloved gift format that is 100 postcards in a box has never been more beautiful. The images include 100 rare portraits of exotic flowers, cacti and succulents from the world-renowned collection of the NY Botanical Garden. Printed on lush, uncoated stock to mimic the original paintings, these brilliantly colored postcards can be mailed, framed or used in craft projects.
