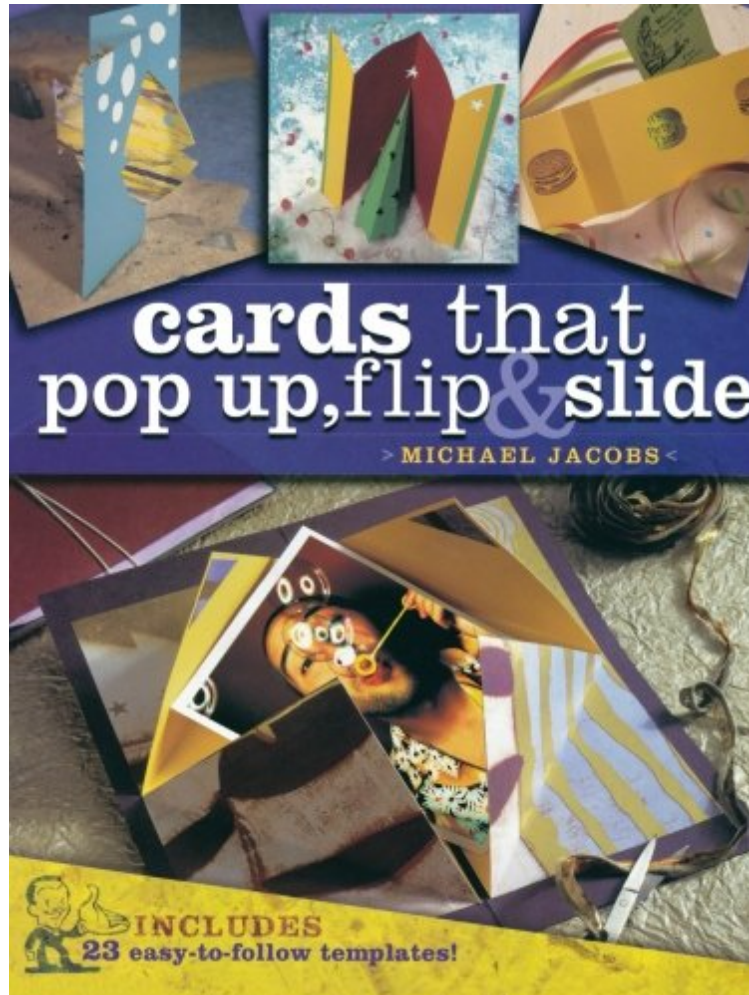

This book reminds me a lot of the types of classes I used to take way back in the day. In the last 5 years or so, there's been an explosion of products, tools, and tutorials on paper crafts within the Craft Hobby

industry. Just check out all the blogs and vlogs from the biannual CHA shows! When I purchased this book, I was aware that some of Jacobs' techniques and tools may be dated, and that was fine. In general, there are easier ways to make scores, cuts, and measurements than shown here. What I was disappointed in however, were the number of photos per project, and their accompanying descriptions. Sometimes there is a huge leap from one step to the next that had even an experienced crafter like me had me scratching my head*. In the case of tutorials, sometimes a picture is worth 1000 words. Although the photographs of the steps are of high quality, the projects would be well served if there were more of them, laid out in a more concise manner. If you enjoy papercrafts, have your scoreboard, punches, and slide-blade papercutter ready and you'll be fine. If you're newer to the wonderful world of cardmaking and papercrafting, this book may be confusing for you. His ideas are not "new", but I do find inspiration on a different take of a familiar project.*For example, Jacobs calls it a flip card, in other circles its called a waterfall card.
